

Conference Location Directions

From the East/I-96/Detroit - take Exit 110, Okemos. Turn north onto Okemos Rd . 2 mile. Turn left onto Jolly Rd. & go 1.5 miles to Hagadorn Rd. Turn right (north) onto Hagadorn and travel 2.9 miles. URC is on the right.

From the West/I-496/Grand Rapids – take I-496 off of I-96. Take Exit 9, Trowbridge Rd., off of I-496 (7.8 miles). Follow Trowbridge Rd. onto the MSU campus (1.9 miles). Turn right onto Wilson Rd. Follow Wilson Rd. 9 miles to east side of campus (curves left). At Shaw Lane, turn right and go to Hagadorn Rd. Shaw dead ends at Hagadorn across from URC but you will need to turn right and perform a Michigan U-turn to be able to enter the URC parking lot.

Magnify God: The Heart of Worship

In Scripture and history, God's glory and grace have informed and shaped how we relate to him. We are awed by his greatness and attracted by his mercy. We're undone by his holiness and drawn by his forgiveness. This pattern is reflected in Isaiah's encounter with God in Isaiah 6 as well as in the scenes of praise around the throne in the book of Revelation. Beholding God's glory and encountering his grace lead to going forth in mission – making the glory of God known to others.

"Musicians know that when the flow of songs isn't right, it's a problem. But meetings are more than music and the gospel affects more than a musical flow. The way God relates to us – by the gospel of grace – is meant to shape the structure, order, and flow of our entire meeting." Bob Kauflin.

This conference is for those who want to grow in biblical understanding and in a theologicallygrounded experience of worship. Pastors, worship leaders, and church members will all benefit. Bob has spoken at conferences around the world, teaching lay people, worship leaders, and pastors not just the how's of worship, but most importantly the who: "I'm increasingly persuaded that we lose direction in our gatherings because we focus primarily on different pieces (songs, announcements, offering, sermon, etc.) rather than the gospel that holds all the pieces together."
